August 31, 1942 - January 15, 2025

We are gathered here today to celebrate and honor our memories in the deepest love of Dorsainvil Saint Victor who departed from us on January 15, 2025.

Born August 31, 1942, the middle child of six to Sir Lelerc and Madam Alicia Saint Victor. Dorsainvil prided himself in intellect and discipline. Finishing elementary and middle school at Lekòl Central de Kaffou then propelling to Lèsa Petión & Lésa Toussaint Louverture for high school.

Never forgetting his love for education, he began his illustrious 19-year career not only as a teacher but also climbing the educational ladder to become a vice principal of College Alpha of Haiti. He met his present love Naromie Pyton who he married in 1984 by 1989 he migrated to the United States to join his wife.

Hitting the ground running he started in the field of construction with his brother-in-law Jean Robert Sanon before exploring broader opportunities a year later in working with American Binders Company in his faithfulness God provided the union with the application of a new home. That same year managing the miracle of the American-Dream for eight years at American binders and company Dorsainvil moved into his new career at Vistas company working at the infamous Joe Robbie stadium where his diligence promoted

him to work at Miami International Airport until retiring in 2020.

Retirement was short-lived as this was the rise of COVID-19. As the country declined into a health crisis, so did the health of those around him and ultimately took the life of his brother-in-law Maestro Daniel J. Pyton and then a year later in 2021 losing his brothers and sister-in-law Adonys Pyton, Jean Robert Sanon, Marie Nicole Pyton and most painfully his wife Naromie Pyton.

Weighted with grief, his health took a turn and it resulted in his inability to walk. As a cancer survivor he continued his battle for four more years until his untimely farewell at 12:06 am on January 15, 2025, in his sleep at Claridge House Nursing home. He leaves behind his sibling: two brothers and sister: Neker, Marc, and Immacula SaintVictor; his six children: Marie Darline, Jean Dato, Harold, Jean Mario SaintVictor, Michael, and Jean StVictor, and a host of other family and friends.
