“ To the family and loved ones of Kitchner,

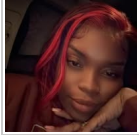

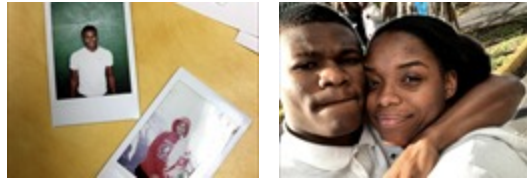
