Luisa became the adopted mother of both her grandchildren, Earvin and Chantal, after her daughter's passing. She compromised work by retiring early to provide the care needed for both and continued to do so well into her 80s.

By July of 2002, Luisa bought a house and moved to Miami, Florida, along with Andres, Earvin, and Chantal. As the years went by, she watched as both children grew up, graduated school, and became independent adults.

Luisa passed away Friday, April 11th, 2025, at the age of 86.

Luisa is survived by her husband Andres Jimenez, two children, two adopted

children, 13 grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, and a host of other family and friends.
