The Beautiful and captivating Milotanne (“Milly”, “Sr. Maccene” “Milou”) Andre, was a beloved wife, mother, daughter, sister, Godmother, First-lady of the church, dear friend and co-worker.

She was born on March 28, 1957, in Acul-Du-Nord, Haiti. She is the second daughter born to Martin Villard Jean-Gilles and Martha Jean-Gilles. After “Milly” graduated from College Pratique-Du-Nord in 1975, she then moved to Miami, Florida in 1979 to continue her education and create a better life for herself.

In 1985, while at church she found the love of her life, Maccene Andre and together they built a beautiful family and legacy. They have been married for 38 years. Milotanne and Maccene went on to have 2 children, Paul Mackenson Andre and Jonathan Leonard Andre. Their love story did not come without challenges as she was unable to conceive until 11 years into their marriage. Her two sons were indeed the love of her life.

Milly was a strong pillar in her community. In fact, she was known as the backbone of the church “Revelation D’en Haut” and generously gave of herself to everyone in need that she encountered. She was best known to be loving yet unapologetically and authentically herself. She was funny, had an enormous heart and wonderful sense of humor and made sure everyone felt

welcome and seen around her. Together she and her husband would host annual revivals that would bring hundreds from all over the world to come together to worship and pray. "Milly" was an example of a woman driven by her purpose and faith in God.

Milotanne's first job was at Johnson & Johnson Corporation and then she went on to work at Cordis Corporation. Prior to her passing she worked as a Senior Clerk for the Florida Department of Health Miami-Dade County WIC Program for the last 21 years. And up until her last days she remained relentless in her desire to continue to provide service to others and be a great employee. She was multilingual and used language to connect and help others. Her true passion was to always make a difference.

Milotanne was a beautiful person inside and out. She had an infectious laugh that could fill up a whole room and brighten up your day. She cared so deeply for the people around her. She was so kind and passionate and always strives to make an impact on everyone's life. She taught us the power of love and faith. Her memory will forever live on in our hearts.

Milotanne was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2008 and successfully went into remission. Unfortunately, in August 2022 she began a new fight with Pancreatic Cancer and after a long 13-month battle she peacefully transitioned on September 28, 2023, at the tender age of 66.

Milotanne was predeceased by her older sister Guilene Jean-Gilles and her father Villard Jean Gilles.
